2	CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF MEETING OF 18th February 2019

3	MATTERS ARISING

4	SCHEME UPDATE	
	Nicola Warren (NW) confirmed that she had reviewed the Visitor Framework and that there had been no change to the number of volunteers on the scheme. There were no issues maintaining the current scheme and carrying out the number of visits required.	
	It was noted that some members of the scheme were not regularly attending meetings, placing pressure on a small number of volunteers to carry out required responsibilities. Additionally, the irregular	

	attendance raised concerns around continuity and consistent standards across all volunteers.	Action

5	Vetting	
	NW provided a reminder to volunteers regarding the need to complete outstanding vetting forms. Some attendees stated that their ID cards were now out of date. NW recorded the names of those with out of date ID cards and agreed to follow this up.

6	OPERATIONAL UPDATE FROM DOG SECTION	
	Due to the busy period following the National Dog Trials and Force Open Day, there was no formal operational update available.	
	Chief Inspector Smith provided a verbal update on a recent successful firearms Investigation involving a deployment of police dogs to assist with D-Day celebrations in Portsmouth.	
	PC North informed us of Police Dog (PD) Ned who had been involved in the successful arrest of perpetrators involved in cash machine fraud.	
	NW suggested that the Force publish recent successful operations on Twitter to promote positive news stories.	
	Chief Inspector Smith stated that the Force were currently in the process of recruiting two new handlers. The new handlers will be active from the end of August. Volunteers were invited to observe training sessions for new handlers.

7	VISIT FRAMEWORK	
	NW noted that this agenda item was for information and that no changes had been made to the number of visits in the framework.	

PC North drew attention to an error in the list. PC Wood's dog had	
been listed as drugs dog, but was actually an explosives dog.

WATERTON	
The next visit to Waterton was to be arranged in August. Martyn Evans (ME) volunteered to attend with Jennifer Deasington (JD).	
JD asked if PC North had any concerns over the conditions dogs were kept in at Waterton. PC North stated the kennels were to expected standards, although admittedly no handler wants to place their dogs in kennels. Also, there were now fewer dogs being kept in the kennels.	
There were discussions around whether the kennels were to be sold. PC North stated that there had been no official confirmation as yet.	
Gill Mason raised concerns over the lack of cover provided to dogs during heat. PC North agreed that he shared concerns over the thought of dogs being left in the heat. However, the dogs did not spend extended periods of time outside. The visitors were satisfied that the handler was aware of the issue and had provided reassurance.

Lisa Winnett (LW) stated that she and JD had recently attended a training session with the Force's Dog Section. The session was very positive and offered a good insight into how handlers interacted with and trained their dogs.	
PC North queried the process of how completed inspection forms were returned to Officers by visitors following an inspection. NW to follow up to gain clarity on the current procedure for submitting forms. Once reasoning behind current procedure had been determined, feedback would be provided on whether the process could be altered to remove the need for submitting paper copies to OPCC.
